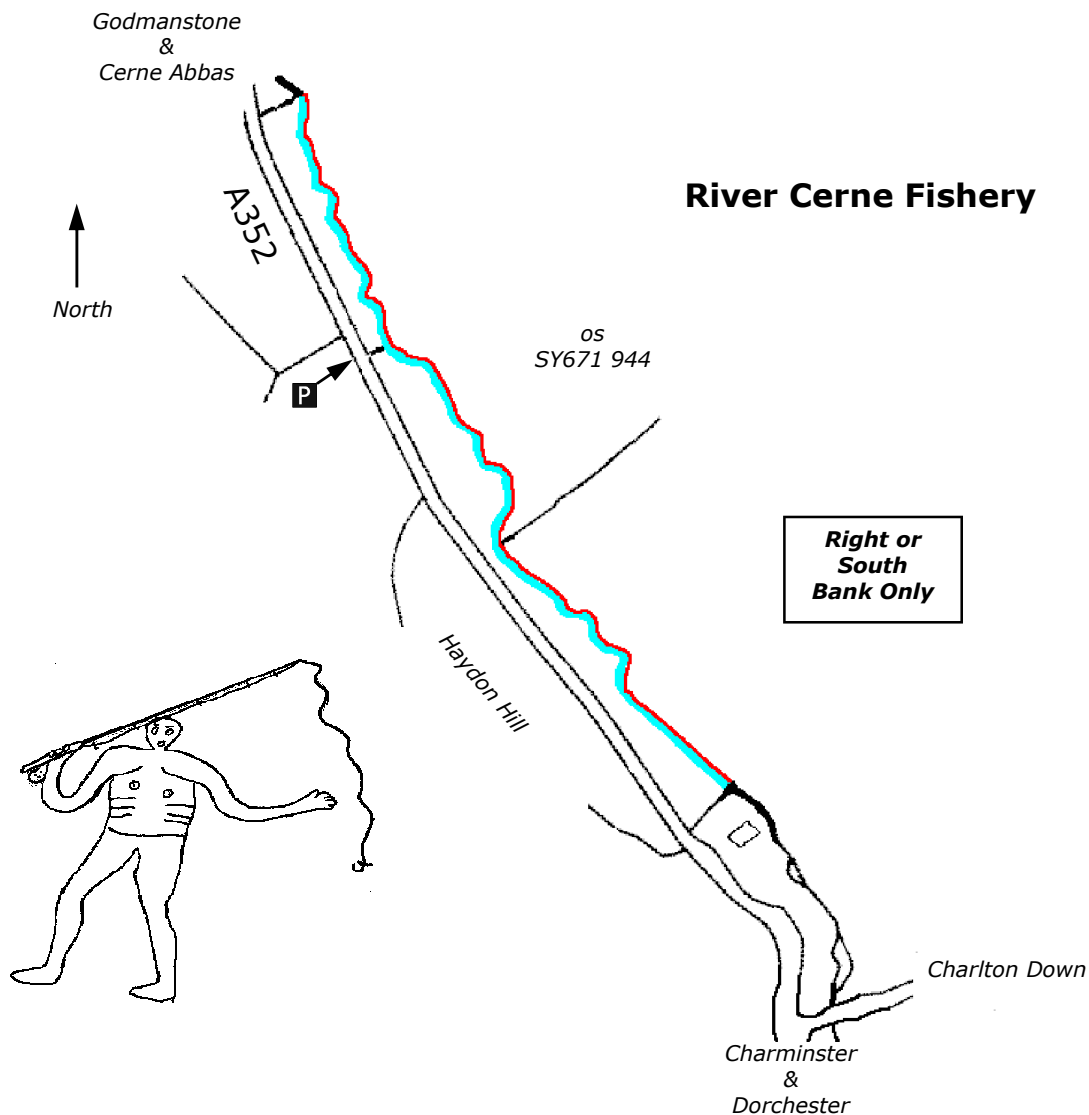




Dorchester Fishing Club

(Founded 1877)



Directions from Dorchester :- Follow the A37 heading towards Yeovil. Turn right onto the A352 and through Charminster. Once through Charminster, follow the road for $\frac{3}{4}$ mile, you will pass the right the turn to Charlton Down (*ex Herrison Hospital*). Travel another $\frac{1}{2}$ mile and the road will straighten. Half way along this straight there is a small car park on the left, opposite this is our access gate, which is marked with red tape on the top bar. We have permission from the Dorset Wildlife Trust to park a single car in the car park. Please take care when crossing the road, our access gate has a combination lock, the code is '1066'. Dial in this number, releasing the shackle by pressing the button on the bottom of the lock. Please remember to jumble the numbers when re-locking the gate. You are now approximately two thirds of the way up the beat. The bottom boundary is the fence line at the bottom of this field, as is the top boundary (*both marked*).

Fishing – This is a small stream and fishing can be at times '*jungle warfare*' & best done whilst wading. There are plenty of access points all along the beat and more than enough room for two anglers. Please use the letter 'I' in your fishing returns pocket book. All brown trout retained shall not be less than 13 inches.

The River Cerne is reserved solely for Members and their accompanied guests.

Please ALWAYS keep to the edges when walking to and from the river.
